Meeting Minutes

Board of Directors Meeting
The Fandom Association of Central
Texas, Inc. - JULY 11, 1999

The Board of Directors ("the Board") of the Fandom Association of Central Texas ("FACT") convened in a regular meeting at the home of FACT members A.T. Campbell, III and Lori Wolf, at 3801 Hawkshead Drive, Austin, Texas on the 11th day of July, 1999 and the duly constituted officers and members of the Board were in attendance, thus constituting a quorum:

Ruben Gamboa, a lapsed FACT member, was also in attendance. He renewed his membership upon receiving this information.

The Minutes of the June 1999 meeting were reviewed and the follow changes were made:

Under the heading ISDC/NSS Convention it should be changed from "FACT had sold approximately \$50.00 worth of books" to "FACT earned \$50.00 in income from sales of books". The June meeting minutes were approved with the change. A.T. made the motion to accept the minutes with the change, Fred seconded, the vote was 4-0-1 as Robert Reedy abstained (he was out of town for the meeting and had no recollections to rely on).

- I. Reports of the Officers of FACT
- a. Chairman's Report Lori suggested that some FACT individual should attend the bulk mailing class offered by the US Postal Service or FACT should contemplate paying a mailing service firm or perhaps, mailing our mass mailing at the first class rate to avoid the headaches that can occur. Discussion ensued with no formal action taken.
- b. President's Report Karen has received an information packet from the Texas Book Festival which will be held November 5-7, 1999 in Austin and suggested FACT sponsor one of the non-profit tables offered at the rate of \$75.00 for both days. FACT cannot sell merchandise (ie books) but could give out flyers for World Fantasy, ArmadilloCon, and FACT; including the reading group and other social events. If space permits we could also include flyers from other fan groups around the state. The motion was proposed by Earl that FACT sponsor such a table in the amount of \$75.00, Fred seconded, the motion passed unanimously. Karen then

requested that other FACT members volunteer to sit at the table also.

Karen also made suggestions regarding a possible party site for the pre-ArmadilloCon post La Fonda San Miguel dinner Thursday night, which the Board agreed she should proceed.

- c. Vice President Report no sightings of Robert have been made in the past month.
- d. Secretary's Report Dan Tolliver did call United Way and found he was the only one from which FACT was receiving a donation. If anyone else thinks their contribution should be going to FACT they need to call and confirm with the United Way.
- e. Treasurer's Report Shane received the bank statements for the month of June at the meeting and gave the totals for each account. FACT \$30850.29, ArmadilloCon \$4235.55, World Fantasy \$1918.21 respectfully. Shane stated he had filed the 1998 IRS reports with help from the archived FACT sheets he received from Karen & Fred.
- f. Registrar's Report With the new members and renewals made in the past month FACT now has approximately 72 members.
- g. Social Director's Report-Renee had not been seen since the FACT swimming outing.
- h. MIS Report Earl reported he has not spoken to Bob Quinlan; therefore there is no report to file
- i. Historian's Report Robert gave a historical perspective on his recent adventures in Corpus Christi as the city has changed over the years.

II. Committee Report

- a. ArmadilloCon 21 This report was given by Ruben who stated that the mass mailing has gone out with lots of mail being received both in returns and in memberships. There will be a meeting next month.
- b. World Fantasy Fred is attempting to work out a schedule for specific staff members of the convention to walk through the hotel and familiarize themselves with Corpus Christi, perhaps the first or second weekend in August.
- 1:40 Carrie Richerson arrived with Jeep and both retreated as AT and Lori were dog sitting Lori's mother dog (an unknown dog to Jeep) and lots of barking transpired.
- c. Office Committee Lori stated that FACT has not totally moved out of 1204 Nueces as there are additional consuite supplies in the middle office downstairs which need to be moved to the storage locker.
- d. Publications- A. T. reported that the June, 1999 FACT Sheet is now on our web site to let folks know what we do. Thanks were given for the SF Crossword Puzzle included in the June, 1999 FACT

- Sheet. (Hopefully the answers will be revealed in the August FACT Sheet.)
- e. Reading Group AT said the reading groups list now goes through September and can be found on our web page also. About 8 folks are regularly attending the bi-monthly sessions.
- f. Nominations Committee is currently in hiatus pending election coverage.
- g. Bylaws Committee Robert Reedy passed out copies of the last amended Bylaws from the March 14, 1999 meeting and stated that e-mail communications were ongoing between the members of the committee.

III. Old Business

- a.- Autographings Lori stated that at this time FACT is not involved in any autographings scheduled at ACS as a co-sponsor.
- b. Literacy Austin Earl noted that he might be doing some web work with the Literacy Austin Council due to contacts he had made at the Book Sale last month.

IV. New Business

a. Ruben Gamboa presented a proposal for ArmadilloCon 22 which was discussed by the Board, Fred made the motion that Ruben be named Chair of ArmadilloCon 22, A.T. seconded, the motion was unanimous by the Board. A mid-August date was given, more details to follow.

Reading Group Report

July 6: Children of God by Mary Doria Russell

Six people participated in the discussion of *Children of God*, which is a current Hugo nominee. This book is the sequel to the Russell's Tiptree Award-winning "Jesuits in space" first novel, *The Sparrow*. The story starts as Father Emilio is finally learning to enjoy life again after the devastating first contact mission to Rakhat. Then the Catholic Church decides to send a second mission to Rakhat, and Emilio is forced to participate. When Emilio and the rest of the mission team arrive, they find that their first visit led to major changes on Rakhat as well as on Earth.

All of us found the story and Russell's prose compelling. One person had not read *The Sparrow*, but he found the author did a good job of filling him in on the necessary background. Emilio is a sympathetic character, so we are pleased when he finds happiness and devastated when the Pope yanks it away from him. This book has a textured and layered structure more ambitious than *The Sparrow*, and it's pulled off beautifully. We learn a lot more about the aliens, but the author avoids making them too human. Various forms of politics (within Earth's government, the Catholic Church, and two alien societies) are important plot elements of this book. This book made us care about its characters, and we laughed, worried, and cried about them.

The book had only minor problems. Emilio is less central to the plot here than he was in *The Sparrow*, which some may find disappointing. A revelation near the end that's supposed to provide a

big conceptual payoff only worked for about half of our group, with the rest finding it a letdown.

Overall half of our group said that the loved this book, and the rest said they liked it a lot. We recommend it to lovers of good fiction.

July 20: The Dazzle of Day by Molly Gloss

Six people showed up for this discussion, including one member we hadn't seen in more than half a year. The *Dazzle of Day* is a science fiction novel about a generation ship filled with multiethnic Quakers. After a brief prologue set before the launch, most of the book is devoted to the generation that will reach the ship's destination.

This book has interesting elements. The use of a Quaker society is an interesting innovation, and the book portrays it accurately as far as we could tell. The characters seem like they fit into this society. The author uses various types of personal relationships to portray cultural diversity. Gloss displays a great ability to display daily life with all its ticks. This book has more bathroom scenes than any other book we could remember. A member of our group who'd spent time with Quakers said that much of their humor is bathroom-related.

We found this book had several flaws. Not much happens in the story, so it lacks dramatic tension. We found the SF content minimal, and felt that the same basic story could have been set on Earth with ships or covered wagons instead of a spaceship. The individual characters seem too uniform, so the author's device of telling different parts of the story through the voices of different characters seems ineffective. While we could see how these characters would work well in a closed society, none of them is interesting to read about. And the book does not even tell the ends of any of their stories, merely providing windows into brief segments of their lives.

While we appreciated Gloss's writing a different and ambitious book, overall we didn't enjoy it much. As one member put it, "rarely have I been so disappointed with a book so well written."




